

IDEAS AND ADVICE FOR HOLDING A FUNDRAISING EVENT FOR CURLEW ACTION

What your money could do

• £25 could allow fieldworkers to install temperature logging equipment in a curlew nest, so we can better protect its inhabitants and contribute data to crucial research projects

 £50 could get two pairs of binoculars for school children in our Junior Curlew Network, allowing them to monitor their local curlews, and helping to develop their passion for conservation

• £150 could pay for a nest camera for fieldworkers doing essential research

 £200 could fund the production of a podcast, bringing you the wisdom of experts and artists in the curlew world


 £250 could help us set up equipment to protect a curlew nest from ground predators

• £750 could allow us to produce a high-quality short film making conservation stories and science come alive, connecting new audiences to curlews on social media

 £1000 could enable us to put on a training workshop for a large group of volunteers and fieldworkers, so that curlews have the best care possible to protect them from predators and other dangers

 And £75,000+ could allow us to fund a PhD study into the causes of curlew predation, ultimately helping to turn the tide against their continuing decline towards extinction in the UK!

What makes community fundraising great?

Everyone wins, your guests have a great time, you have a great time and you raise money for charity!

YOUR ESSENTIAL GUIDE TO HOW AND WHERE TO FUNDRAISE

At home, or out and about

Tips - You could either do an activity with your family and ask them for donations, do something virtual and get distant friends involved via video call, or even head out into the world to fundraise - the sky's the limit!

- Sponsored walk/run/cycle/swim a classic: we love the curlew-shaped walk, but if you're super fit, you could even try running a marathon
- Sports day (egg-and-spoon, sack race, threelegged race, tug-of-war... get lots of families involved for extra fun and fundraising)
- Celebration (hold a charity appeal at your birthday, anniversary or wedding, or raise money in memory of a family member or friend)
- Outdoor film night (pick a warm summer night and borrow a projector, then get everyone outdoors to watch a film on cushions and blankets - charge entry and make extra money with snacks)
- **Coffee morning/brunch** (a great way to catch up with friends and raise some money)
- **Sponsored skydive or abseil** (for the adventurous!)













At school or at a club

Tips - Make it fun and curlew themed, and keep it simple! If you're choosing a place to set up your event, make it somewhere visible that people will pass through and stop, such as outside the canteen or school entrance.

- **Guess the ...** number of sweets in the jar, weight of the fruitcake... the possibilities are endless! You can charge some money per guess, and the winner gets the sweets
- **Throw sponges -** find a willing teacher, then charge people £1 to throw a sponge at them, and have some fun making money for charity!
- Bake sale make some curlew biscuits or cakes to sell to friends at lunch
- **Stream yourself gaming -** and ask your friends for a small donation to watch or get involved
- Non-uniform day a fun and easy way to raise some money
- **Car wash -** set yourself up in the car park washing parents' cars and charging a small fee but only wash their car if they want you to!

• **Craft making** - this could be seasonal, for instance making halloween masks, easter curlew eggs, or Christmas wreaths





Tips - Use social media to spread the word about your fundraising, and get lots of people involved. Students are not famed for their big bank accounts, so rather than asking for massive donations, ask for lots of them!

- Karaoke an easy one get a karaoke machine, or just a computer, and charge entry
- **Speed dating** get people to donate an entry fee, and get them moving around the room chatting to potential partners much more fun than tinder
- Jailbreak teams compete with 36 hours to get as far away from the start point as possible using none of their own money; they have to hitchhike, go on foot, or even try to blag free trains and flights; you raise money by being sponsored beforehand/afterwards, and money raised en route is used for travel
- **Try to beat a record** get sponsored, then find some easy records you can beat with friends
- **Second hand clothes sale** it's a win-win situation: get rid of your old clothes, and make some money for charity
- Shave your hair or dye it
- Board game tournament get your mates involved; everyone donates, then play for a prize
- Host a cocktail evening





Tips - Your colleagues will be busy so be clear about why you are fundraising and what you want from them; ultimately if you make your fundraising appeal fun and interesting, they will want to take part! Some employers offer support, time off or even funding for charity work, and it's worth making the most of this when possible.

- **Give something up** the more difficult, the more sponsorship you will get if you are always eating chocolate, people will be impressed to see you give it up
- Matched giving if your company matches donations given or raised by employees, make sure you make the most of this when giving to Curlew Action
- **Charity dinner/dance** a real money-spinner: invite colleagues, friends and families everyone dresses up and pays entry, and make sure to tell your guests about Curlew Action and why it is important to you
- Raffle and/or bingo combine with the above for a proper charity gala
- Quiz night as above, but even if you're not holding a gala, you can still
 run a quiz night this works really well on zoom so can be done from
 home

Steps to getting started

- 1. **Pick an event -** use our handy guide above to find something appropriate for you
- 2. **Choose a date** give yourself time to plan it the more time, the more donations you can get
- 3. **Pick your venue -** if you want an audience, choose somewhere easy to get to where lots of people will see you)
- 4. **Set up a donation page -** the most popular websites are JustGiving and Virgin Money Giving provide some info about curlew action so people know why you're raising money, and make sure you set a target it's better to choose one you are confident you can beat!
- 5. **Spread the word** use social media and tell your friends and colleagues you could even ask local businesses to get involved by donating a prize
- 6. **Have fun raising some money** hold your event and enjoy it your enthusiasm will get people donating, so make sure you are doing something fun
- 7. **Donate** your funds on the curlew action website (don't forget to leave a note with your donation, letting us know who you are and what you got up to!)
